Dear Supervisors of the checklist for Londonderry NH,

Whereas--

Permanent Moves Reported to USPS

Starting on July 1, 2022, the Secretary of State is required to check NH voter addresses against the US Postal Service change of address system and notify supervisors of the checklist of permanent moves. RSA 654:45

"Notices of Transfer, notices of a permanent change of address with the United States Postal Service or the Division of Motor Vehicles, or official death notices **permit removal without a 30-day letter** because each exception has additional information that ties the event to your voter."

NEW HAMPSHIRE ELECTION PROCEDURE MANUAL: 2022-2023 , page 205.

I have attached a list of 1083 voters drawn from the USPS movers list. These people moved between October 2018 and October 2022 and are still on the Londonderry alpha voters list that was created by yourselves on August 16, 2023. The change of address barcode is included in the spreadsheet so that you can reference.

Unfortunately, I have found that at least 95 of the people on this list voted in the November 3, 2020 election after they moved out of town. Keeping the checklist up to date is important to prevent these types of errors from occurring.

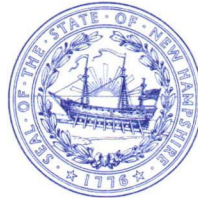

Re: Alleged Wrongful Voting—95 persons who voted in November 3, 2020, election in Londonderry.

Dear Representative Perez:

The purpose of this letter is to respond to your December 6, 2023, communications that identified 95 voters who you alleged wrongfully voted in the November 3, 2020, election in Londonderry.

The only justification that you provided for your suspicion that these 95 people wrongfully voted was that an unnamed “source” compared the voter checklist against the National Change of Address Program. As we explained to you previously, there are numerous innocent reasons one household member may retain their address despite another household member moving out of that address. A review of a sample of the names that you reported revealed no evidence suggesting that any of those people violated a state election law.

The Election Law Unit cannot investigate voters based solely on a person’s unsupported suspicion that the voters may have violated an election law. Accordingly, the Election Law Unit cannot investigate the remaining names in your report based your unsupported allegations that they may have wrongfully voted. Should you discover evidence demonstrating that one of these voters was not, in-fact, domiciled in Londonderry, please provide it to this Office, and we will review that evidence.

I. Background:

Over the past few months, the Election Law Unit has been copied on communications to and from the Londonderry Supervisors of the Checklist regarding efforts of the Supervisors to remove registered voters who no longer reside in Londonderry from the checklist. The Supervisors appear to have politely and diligently

responded to all inquiries, and the Supervisors appear to be following the requirements of RSA chapter 654.

On December 6, 2023, you reported to this Office that you had a list of 95 voters who wrongfully voted in the November 3, 2020, election in Londonderry. When asked how you knew these people wrongfully voted in that election, you responded only that a “reliable source” used the National Change of Address and 2020 Londonderry voter checklist to figure it out. You declined to identify your source. During that call, an investigator from this Office explained to you that just because one or more members of a household moved that does not mean the entire household moved and should be removed from the checklist.

You subsequently e-mailed the list of 95 voters who you alleged wrongfully voted. That list included the names of 95 persons with Londonderry addresses. Your e-mail did not contain any other attachments or explanation as to why you believed these 95 people wrongfully voted in Londonderry.

This Office reviewed a sample of 10 voters in six households from your list. This Office’s review did not reveal any violation of State election laws. For example, in one case, two voters did not improperly vote in Londonderry because, although their mother sold her Londonderry house, they continued to live in Londonderry at their father’s residence. In another case, two UOCAVA voters continued to use their prior Londonderry address to vote absentee, despite the parents of one of those voters having sold the Londonderry home. RSA 657:2 specifically allows persons eligible to vote as a UOCAVA voter to vote absentee at state elections in the “city or town which was his or her last home.” In other cases, voters sold their residences days or weeks before the November 3, 2020, election, but there was no evidence that they established domicile in another municipality prior to the election. See RSA 654:2 (once domiciled is established, it “continues to exist until another such domicile is gained”).

II. The Election Law Unit cannot investigate citizens based on unsupported suspicion:

Based on the information that you were willing to provide to this Office, it appears the only reason you believe these 95 people wrongfully voted in the November 3, 2020, Londonderry election is that the people lived at an address from which a household member moved. This Office explained to you that there are any number of reasons why a person may lawfully continue to vote in Londonderry. This Office’s review of a sample of the names confirms that there was no evidence the reviewed voters wrongfully voted in Londonderry.

This Office opens investigations when it receives credible reports of election law violations. Unsupported suspicions that misconduct may have occurred are not an appropriate basis for initiating an election law violation investigation. Put differently, this Office cannot invade the privacy of citizens by opening investigations without a reasonable belief that those citizens violated the law.

Taken together, your communications and list of names cannot justify this Office opening investigations into each of people on your list.

Hello Kristin, Brian and Barbara,

I have located the minutes from the Friday October 6th Supervisors of the checklist meeting as they came to be available on the early evening of Friday October 13th, 2023.

I have looked carefully at the lists from both the October 6th meeting and the September 20th meeting and have found the following names where no action was taken by yourselves. The names were not removed, nor was a 30 day letter sent. For a number of them, their home was sold in the same month as the USPS move notification, so they could have easily been removed. Please take immediate action to remove these names.:

In addition, I have attached a spreadsheet in which the second tab shows 141 households in which only one or sometimes two members of the household have been removed even though the homes at the addresses have clearly changed hands around the same date of the USPS moved notification. In the vast majority of the instances, the USPS move notification barcode is the same for all members of the household, yet of the 323 people on the list, you have chosen to send 30 day notices to 175 of them, over half. For a few of these, I have done the research myself and found the property records that corroborate with the USPS move notification. Since you have already sent the 30 day notices, I did not do all of property transition data, but you can see the trend. Of course, there are a minority of apartment dwellers and as no property transition can be verified, a 30 day notice may be appropriate for apartment dwellers if you do not accept the USPS move notification alone. Previously, you told me that you did not remove all the names in a household because the list was alphabetical by first name. However, in this instance, my list is alphabetical by last name and is an excel spreadsheet that can be sorted easily by name, address, etc.

Your overly strict interpretation of the laws have shown to not allow you to perform your duties in a timely or efficient manner when it comes to voters who have moved. Here you have town records accessible to you in addition to USPS database information that show that people have moved, yet it is not enough for you. If a resident sends notification to Town Hall that they have moved out of Town or State, is that enough for you?

This practice has led to an incredible backlog of moved voters since at least 2018 who are still on the checklist 5 years later.

I am respectfully asking you at this time to provide a plan and a process to avoid this going forward. The backlog has <LONDONDERRY Rockingham county-moved-Still on Voters list.xlsx> damaged the integrity of our elections and has now caused you to scramble to clean the list by the end of the 2023. What are you doing to clean people who have moved prior to October 2018? What is your plan going forward? How do you plan to efficiently and thoroughly removing movers who have moved since July 1, 2023?

Thank you for taking the time to respond to all of my questions and requested actions.

I expect a response within 5 business days, or at the very latest by October 26, 2023, the day after your next scheduled meeting.

As for the why behind the 389 vs full 1088, it is because everyone else either had been removed already or moved within Londonderry.

As you'll see in the minutes, all lists we've received from the SOS have now been fully processed.

All voters who were sent 30-day notices and do not provide evidence of continued eligibility within that timeframe will be removed at the next session of the Supervisors. For this batch of voters, that will be at our November 17th session. You'll see those names in the minutes for that session!

I greatly appreciate you keeping in touch and keeping me up to date on progress, however,

It seems as if you forgot to include the lists of names that I requested— I need the information to reconcile with my list that was culled from the USPS database of movers:

1. The list of names of people sent 30 day letters during the October 6 2023 Session. (Why only 389 of 1083?)
2. The list of names of all people who have been removed since the September 20, 2023 session, up to and including the October 6, 2023 Session.
3. Please also send me the full meeting minutes from Oct 6, 2023.

I sent a list to you of 1083 people who had moved out of Londonderry since 2018 and are still on the voter rolls. The SOS has been sending you verified USPS lists of names to be removed since July 2022, yet most of those names remain on the list.

I need assurance from you that the Voter list is cleaned up by the end of this year.

I will follow up with you on November 5th (30 days) for the names of people removed that had been sent 30 day notices.

The Supervisors discussed the list provided via email of more than 1,000 voters a private citizen believes may be ineligible to vote in Londonderry. Supervisor Grages reported that she had compared the list provided with the current registered voter list. Based on this comparison, Supervisor Grages was able to identify 389 people who may no longer be eligible to vote in Londonderry. The Supervisors discussed whether to send 30-day letters or directly remove voters, as was the private citizen's preference. While the Supervisors understand the logistical challenges and costs associated with sending 389 letters, NH RSA 654:44 requires sending these 30-day letters. The provisions to remove voters without 30-day letters require direct notice of transfer from another state or board of supervisors in NH (NH RSA 654:36) or direct notice from the USPS, the department of safety, or as communicated by the secretary of state (NH RSA 654:36b).

Hi Maureen,

I compared your list of 1,088 with our current list of registered voters (excluding the more than 600 people pending removal this evening) and found about 20 people who were on both lists. I have not yet reviewed those 20 people with the remainder of the board of Supervisors, however, so the total list of 30-day letters may vary.

I too believe deeply in not levying unnecessary costs on Londonderry tax payers. Whenever we are presented with information out of standard channels (ie not provided directly from the Secretary of State or other official channels), our general practice is to generate a 30-day letter for any voters we believe are no longer eligible. That was why I indicated it likely that would be how we would proceed.

As with all decisions regarding changes to the voter checklist, I will confer with the other Supervisors (who are on this thread) and we will discuss how to proceed with these 20 voters at our session this evening.

Thank you so much for your inquiry. I am the chair of the Supervisors of the Checklist in Londonderry and am responsible, along with two other Supervisors, for the addition, amendment or removal of anyone on our voter registration list. I'll be happy to provide information to you related to your email below.

Per NH law, there are three mechanisms the Supervisors have to remove people from the checklist. The first is via notice (with sufficient evidence) from another state of that person registering in that state. The second is notice from the New Hampshire Division of Vital Records indicating that a person has died. The last is through a process called a 30-day letter. That process requires the Supervisors to have reason to believe that a voter is no longer eligible to vote in Londonderry. With that, we send a 30-day letter to the address we have on file, giving the voter 30 days to provide evidence that they are, in fact, an eligible voter in town. In the absence of that proof, the voter is removed from the voter registration list at the next session of the Supervisors. Supervisors are only permitted to send 30-day letters and make changes to the voter registration list during official, noticed sessions.

Upon investigation, we are confident that each of the people listed below were duly qualified and eligible voters at the time of their registration.

Your message has prompted us to flag some voters listed below for 30-day letters. Because of the timing of this information, they will remain on the voter list through the November election. That said, we do have a mechanism in place for us should one of the voters we have flagged in the 30-day process present themselves to vote on Election Day.

In NH, College students (like all residents) must select one domicile/residence. If that domicile remains their home town, they are eligible to vote there. If that domicile is their college town, then they would vote there. As with all voters, they can only choose one.

NH defines domicile for voting purposes as, "that place upon which leaving you intend BBC to return." If a college student is temporarily living away from home but intends to return, that would legally qualify as domicile.

The Supervisors discussed the list provided via email of more than 1,000 voters a private citizen believes may be ineligible to vote in Londonderry. Supervisor Grages reported that she had compared the list provided with the current registered voter list. Based on this comparison, Supervisor Grages was able to identify 389 people who may no longer be eligible to vote in Londonderry. The Supervisors discussed whether to send 30-day letters or directly remove voters, as was the private citizen's preference. 4. Finally, for this communication, there are a number of people on the NCOA list for whom a new Londonderry address was provided by the SOS. These are designated as NCOA address. I went and looked at the official instructions from the SOS and the direction was to send 30 day notices to all of these people to confirm the address change. I have noted that none of them have had 30 day notices sent by yourselves. Please do so.

From the instructions from the SOS:

Scenario 3. Your voter has moved within your town/district or city/ward and remains in the same town/district or city/ward.

o Do not remove this voter from your checklist. • If the new address does not change the voter's polling place, update the address in SVRS. Send a letter to the voter to confirm the address change or have the ballot clerks use the statutory check-in process to verify the new address at the next election. (See Important Note below)

Also, thank you for finally checking the list of homes sold as you are able to do per **Supervisors to Review Property Transfers RSA 74:18 (2021)**, but I have noticed that you are only sending 30 day notices to one person in the household. **It would be best to filter these homes by address and send the 30 day notice to ALL members of the household. It is more efficient and more likely to catch all voters that are no longer eligible.**

Here is one example:

Howard Tocman at 5 Wallace Circle was sent a 30 day notice but his wife, Beth Amy Goldberg was not. Also, his daughter, Sami Tocman was not. They all resided at the same address.

Pending removal is the term the system uses for voters we have flagged for consideration and removal. These are the voters who we vote on for removal at the end of our session. Everyone on the "Pending Removal" list moved to "Removed" at the end of our session when we voted. Should anyone have been rejected for removal, we would have indicated that in

the minutes and they would remain on the public list in Town Hall.

PMJ is the system indication that the pending removal voter moved out of our jurisdiction.

PRM refers to pending voters who moved out of state.

PDN refers to pending voters for whom we have received notice of death.

As mentioned in our minutes, we are part of the way through processing the NCOA list.

When we received it, it was sorted by First Name and that was how we started the process of removing voters. Because of that, people who were at the same address or even with the same last name wouldn't be processed at the same time.

Thank you for your detailed response. I am sorry for my delayed response but my computer was in the shop for 10 days.

I hope that you are willing to answer some questions that I still have:

1. Are the procedures that were added based on the amended election laws documented? Is there an SOP for example? Can I see it?
2. Does the report obtained from the USPS include the change of address barcode?
3. Is the report obtained from the USPS sent to the supervisors as a spreadsheet so that they can filter as needed, or is it sent as a PDF?
4. Is the report obtained from the USPS sent to the supervisors in alphabetical

order by last name? If not, why not?

5. Does the report obtained from the USPS include all members of each household who have moved and requested mail forwarding or only the Primary person filling out the form for the household? If all household members are on the form filled out but not included in the report, why not?

6. If the Supervisors receive a request for removal from a source other than the *"receipt a report from the United States Postal Service or the department of safety directly or as communicated by the secretary of state through the centralized voter registration database that a voter has permanently changed his or her address to another town, city, or state" RSA 654:36-b."* Is the SOS office available to help confirm moves based on USPS database access that they have? Or other database access?

7. Is it possible for the Supervisors to request a report from the USPS?

8. When you say that the Supervisors should review all evidence, does that include looking at the USPS change of address barcode from an official report and comparing it to the USPS change of address barcode of other members in the household?

As you suggested, I am continuing to communicate directly with the Supervisors in Londonderry and I have asked some of the same questions directly to them. I am awaiting answers now for about 2 weeks. I understand that there is a backlog, but I have concerns that the Supervisors will not clear the list prior to the Primary election.

Dear Maureen Hardy:

Thank you for contacting the Secretary of State's Office regarding your concerns with checklist maintenance by the Londonderry Supervisors of the Checklist. The Secretary of State's Office provides guidance and training to Supervisors, however, as locally elected public officials the Supervisors report to the voters in Londonderry. Our office does not have supervisory authority over supervisors, we make our best efforts to help them.

The legislature has amended the election laws to add procedures to help ensure that the checklists are current and accurate. The Secretary of State now provides Supervisors of the Checklist with a report we obtain from the United States Postal Service of individual permanent moves, where the available evidence is that a registered voter has informed the Postal Service that the voter has permanently moved away from the address at which the voter is registered. The postal service system collects information on temporary forwarding, business, family, and individual moves. To comply with the legal standards for removing a person from the checklist, we obtain and send to the Supervisors only information on individual permanent moves.

The legislature now requires that towns and cities provide the Supervisors of the Checklist with copies of the Inventory of Property Transfer forms. RSA 74:18. These forms are required for property tax purposes, to assist towns and cities with keeping the records current on who owns property. Some Inventory of Property Tax forms result from the owner(s) selling and moving to a different address, sometimes a different town/city/state. Others result from legal transfer of ownership in circumstances where some or all of the same people continue to live at the property, but ownership is transferred. One example is transfer from parents to a child as an element of estate planning. Another is transfer from an individual as owner to a trust as owner. Therefore, our guidance to supervisors is that they must evaluate all available evidence on a case-by-case basis. When the evidence supports doing so, it is appropriate for the supervisors to send the registered voters who more likely than not have moved a letter advising them that they will be removed from the checklist unless they provide evidence within 30 days that they continue to be domiciled at the address where registered.

In both circumstances, these sources of information that a person has moved may contain a significant backlog on potential cases for 30-day letters or removal. We expect that after the initial implementation of these requirements and adopting a routine for processing new information, that supervisors will more easily keep

current.

The election law also allows anyone to submit a request to correct the checklist to the supervisors. This is often a circumstance where a voter notices the name of a former neighbor or relative on the checklist who has died or moved out-of-town. It can also be a circumstance where the request is based on commercially obtained information on people who are reported as having moved. The supervisors have a duty under law to evaluate the request and the evidence presented to "determine whether or not it is more likely than not that the person's qualifications are in doubt." RSA 654:36-a.

For notices received from the United States Postal Service, RSA 654:36-b authorizes the supervisors to either remove a voter from the checklist or send the voter a 30-day letter. The statute authorizes removal without a 30-day letter only if the supervisors "receive a report from the United States Postal Service or the department of safety directly or as communicated by the secretary of state through the centralized voter registration database that a voter has permanently changed his or her address to another town, city, or state" RSA 654:36-b. This statute does not authorize removal when the information comes from any other source. If the information is from a source other than the United State Postal Service as provided by the Secretary of State and the information makes it more likely than not the voter moved, a 30-day letter process must be used before the voter can be removed from the checklist.

We recommend that you continue to communicate directly with your elected supervisors regarding your concerns with the Londonderry checklist. We have and will continue to provide guidance and training on checklist maintenance. The information available to us indicates that the Londonderry supervisors are engaged in this effort and are making progress addressing the accumulated records from both Postal Service information on permanent moves and property transfer records that provide evidence of a possible move. These part-time elected officials have taken on a significant effort to implement these changes to New Hampshire law. Implementation of the new law requires processing of a large number of potential moves. We encourage patience as the supervisors work through this process.

Members of The Supervisors of the Londonderry Checklist,

In response to the letters sent by you as well as Mr. Malaguti, I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge your concerns and the uncomfortable feelings caused by my elevated tone during the meeting on September 20, 2023. I regret that I was responsible for that outcome. My overwhelming frustrations unfortunately became evident. Please understand that my only goal, as I am sure is yours, is to guarantee that only legal Londonderry residents are allowed to vote in any election. I became very concerned when I learned that there were over 1000 names of those that had potentially left the town between 2018 and 2022 whose names remained on the legal voter registry. After multiple communications between the Secretary of States office and Kirsten Hildonen to understand the laws and exactly what was needed to be done, I felt the need to be present at the next available meeting. I was only there as a very concerned citizen of Londonderry. The references to my position as a State Representative were only used as a comparison of and not a statement of my representation at the meeting.

Going forward I would like to offer some suggestions:

I understand that you have guidelines that are put forward by the Secretary of State's office. They are guidelines and it appears that they offer no process by which to do your elected responsibilities in the most efficient and timely manner. I would like to suggest that you develop protocols and/or procedures that would work best for you as a group and perhaps be available in the future for any new person in that position.

I have been made aware by the Rockingham Registry of Deed office that all transactions of property are electronically sent to the Londonderry Assessor's office within 10 days of recording, making that information available for the asking. Perhaps obtaining that information for the previous weeks prior to your meetings would offer the opportunity to send 30-day letters and assist in keeping the voter list current thus avoiding long delays as found from 2018 to 2022. This has always been available, but I do not recall you mentioning this opportunity as something that has been utilized by you in the past.

I would also like to see that all family members are removed at the same time when that information is available, especially now that you have the USPS "change of address" available to you.

Please allow me to offer my assistance in implementing any of these suggestions.

In a town the size of Londonderry and with the fluctuation in voter turnout, outcomes can often be determined by a small number of votes. Therefore, the accuracy of the voter list is of the utmost importance and crucial to the integrity of the town.

IN addition, I have attached a spreadsheet in which the second tab shows 141 households in which only one or sometimes two members of the household have been removed even though the homes at the addresses have clearly changed hands around the same date of the USPS moved notification. In the vast majority of the instances, the USPS move notification barcode is the same for all members of the household, yet of the 323 people on the list, you have chosen to send 30 day notices to 175 of them, over half. For a few of these, I have done the research myself and found the property records that corroborate with the USPS move notification. Since you have already sent the 30 day notices, I did not do all of property transition data, but you can see the trend. Of course, there are a minority of apartment dwellers and as no property transition can be verified, a 30 day notice may be appropriate for

apartment dwellers if you do not accept the USPS move notification alone. Previously, you told me that you did not remove all the names in a household because the list was alphabetical by first name. However, in this instance, my list is alphabetical by last name and is an excel spreadsheet that can be sorted easily by name, address, etc.

Your overly strict interpretation of the laws have shown to not allow you to perform your duties in a timely or efficient manner when it comes to voters who have moved. Here you have town records accessible to you in addition to USPS database information that show that people have moved, yet it is not enough for you. If a resident sends notification to Town Hall that they have moved out of Town or State, is that enough for you?

This practice has led to an incredible backlog of moved voters since at least 2018 who are still on the checklist 5 years later.

I am respectfully asking you at this time to provide a plan and a process to avoid this going forward. The backlog has <LONDONDERRY Rockingham county-moved-Still on Voters list.xlsx> damaged the integrity of our elections and has now caused you to scramble to clean the list by the end of the 2023. What are you doing to clean people who have moved prior to October 2018? What is your plan going forward? How do you plan to efficiently and thoroughly removing movers who have moved since July 1, 2023?

As a body, we review all information we are presented to determine if that evidence suggests a voter is no longer eligible to vote. Where that is the case, we are bound by the laws of New Hampshire in the ways in which we can remove voters. As I've mentioned before, by statute, we can only remove voters without a 30-day notice due to very specific circumstances. While I understand your concern that our adherence to those laws restricts the timeliness in which we can make changes to the checklist, I am confident that you are not asking me to ignore the laws of New Hampshire to meet your expectations.

An important note as you reference the sale of homes in your email. A person who is a United States Citizen, who has an established domicile in Londonderry, for example a young person growing up in the family home in Londonderry, is eligible to register and vote when age 18. If that person enrolls in college in Manchester and lives in a dorm in Manchester while attending college the person has the choice of either registering and voting in Londonderry under RSA 654:2 while they are temporarily absent due to attending college out-of-town or of registering and voting in Manchester under RSA 654:1, I-a at the address where the person is living while in college.

Maureen Hardy:

Several categories of voters by statute may register and vote either where they had a domicile prior to qualifying for the category, for your question - prior to becoming a student or teacher, or where they live while a student or teacher. They can only vote from one place, but the law gives them the choice.

654:2 Temporary Absence or Presence. –

I. A domicile for voting purposes acquired by any person in any town shall not be interrupted or lost by a temporary absence therefrom with the intention of returning thereto as his or her domicile. Domicile for the purpose of voting as defined in RSA 654:1, once existing, continues to exist until another such domicile is gained. Domicile for purposes of voting is a question of fact and intention coupled with a verifiable act or acts carrying out that intent. A voter can have only one domicile for voting purposes. No person shall be deemed to have lost a domicile by reason of his or her presence or absence while the voter or his or her spouse is employed in the service of the United States; nor while engaged in the navigation of the waters of the United States or of the high seas; nor **while a teacher in or student of any seminary of learning**; nor while confined in any public prison or other penal institution; nor while a patient or confined for any reason in any nursing, convalescent home or hospital, old folks or old age home, or like institution or private facility.

Categories of voters (voter and spouse) who can choose to either continue voting at the domicile they had before entering the listed status or to vote where they are living while in the listed status. These are examples I have encountered, not an exhaustive list:

- Employed in the service of the United States (military members and spouses stationed on bases around the US, working for federal agency or Member of Congress/Senator in Washington, DC, are examples);
- Working and living elsewhere while engaged in being Captain or crew on a ship;
- College student or teacher/professor;
- Person in pre-trial detention or serving a sentence for a misdemeanor in a county House of Corrections;
- Person living in a long term rehabilitation facility;
- Person who has moved into a nursing home or like facility.

In a separate provision, the law recognizes that a student may register and vote in the town or ward where they actually live:

654:1 Voter; Office Holder. –

I. Every inhabitant of the state, having a single established domicile for voting purposes, being a citizen of the United States, of the age provided for in Article 11 of Part First of the Constitution of New Hampshire, shall have a right at any meeting or election, to vote in the town, ward, or unincorporated place in which he or she is domiciled. An inhabitant's domicile for voting purposes is that one place where a person, more than any other place, has established a physical presence and manifests an intent to maintain a single continuous presence for domestic, social, and civil purposes relevant to participating in democratic self-government. A person has the right to change

domicile at any time, however a mere intention to change domicile in the future does not, of itself, terminate an established domicile before the person actually moves.

I-a. A student of any institution of learning may lawfully claim domicile for voting purposes in the New Hampshire town or city **in which he or she lives** while attending such institution of learning if such student's claim of domicile otherwise meets the requirements of RSA 654:1, I.

A student may register and vote in the town or city ward where they actually live, regardless of where the college they are attending is located. While this is statutory in New Hampshire, a series of court decisions across the US decades ago established that status as a student does not limit that person's right to register and vote – the same requirements apply to students and non-students alike. Therefore, the same rule would apply even if we did not have this statute.

Your questions have been referred to me for a response. You have asked:

1. Are the procedures that were added based on the amended election laws documented? Is there an SOP for example? Can I see it?

Election Procedure Manual – Pages 2 and 221. See attached “Implementation of National Change of Address Notices.”

2. Does the report obtained from the USPS include the change of address barcode?

We received a 3 digit “Delivery Point Barcode” as numbers. We do not know what you mean by “change of address barcode.”

3. Is the report obtained from the USPS sent to the supervisors as a spreadsheet so that they can filter as needed, or is it sent as a PDF?

The Secretary of State’s Election’s Division sends the Supervisors the NCOA data in an Excel file. Supervisors may use Excel functions to sort or reorganize the data to the extent they find that helpful.

4. Is the report obtained from the USPS sent to the supervisors in alphabetical order by last name? If not, why not?

No. The data is sent in the order that the vendor for the USPS

provides it to the Secretary of State's Office. We expect supervisors will often look up the voters by voter ID number, however, supervisors may resort the file by whatever order they find most helpful.

5. Does the report obtained from the USPS include all members of each household who have moved and requested mail forwarding or only the Primary person filling out the form for the household? If all household members are on the form filled out but not included in the report, why not?

No. New Hampshire law requires that information make it more likely than not that a specific person has permanently moved away from the address at which they are registered to permit removal from the checklist. We conclude that evidence that a family moved does not meet this legal standard for registered voters who are not individually listed in the NCOA report.

6. If the Supervisors receive a request for removal from a source other than the "*receipt a report from the United States Postal Service or the department of safety directly or as communicated by the secretary of state through the centralized voter registration database that a voter has permanently changed his or her address to another town, city, or state . . .*" RSA 654:36-b.". Is the SOS office available to help confirm moves based on USPS database access that they have? Or other database access?

No.

7. Is it possible for the Supervisors to request a report from the USPS?

New Hampshire law requires the Secretary of State to obtain and report the NCOA data. This is a new procedure. We are working with Supervisors to determine what frequency of delivering reports will be most useful for maintaining checklists. New Hampshire law limits with whom the supervisors may share Statewide Voter Registration System data. There is no current statutory authority explicitly permitting supervisors to share that data with NCOA vendors.

8. When you say that the Supervisors should review all evidence, does that include looking at the USPS change of address barcode from an official report and comparing it to the USPS change of address barcode of other members in

the household?

No. The guidance is that supervisors consider other evidence pertinent to the voter under consideration before acting on the NCOA data. For example, if the NCOA indicates a voter moved and that person is a neighbor of a supervisor and the supervisor knows the person has not moved, that local knowledge evidence should be considered. As currently used NCOA is one tool focused on the voter whose name is listed in the NCOA report as permanently moving. To the extent supervisors have evidence that makes it more likely than not that several voters who live at one address all moved, it is appropriate for the supervisors to send any voter not listed on the NCOA report or Notice of Transfer Report a 30 day letter.

I am the chair of the Supervisors of the Checklist in Londonderry and am responsible, along with two other Supervisors, for the addition, amendment or removal of anyone on our voter registration list. I'll be happy to provide information to you related to your email below.

Per NH law, there are three mechanisms the Supervisors have to remove people from the checklist. The first is via notice (with sufficient evidence) from another state of that person registering in that state. The second is notice from the New Hampshire Division of Vital Records indicating that a person has died. The last is through a process called a 30-day letter. That process requires the Supervisors to have reason to believe that a voter is no longer eligible to vote in Londonderry. With that, we send a 30-day letter to the address we have on file, giving the voter 30 days to provide evidence that they are, in fact, an eligible voter in town. In the absence of that proof, the voter is removed from the voter registration list at the next session of the Supervisors. Supervisors are only permitted to send 30-day letters and make changes to the voter registration list during official, noticed sessions.

Upon investigation, we are confident that each of the people listed below were duly qualified and eligible voters at the time of their registration.

Your message has prompted us to flag some voters listed below for 30-day letters. Because of the timing of this information, they will remain on the voter list through the November election. That said, we do have a mechanism in place for us should one of the voters we have flagged in the 30-day process present themselves to vote on Election Day.

Thank you so much for your inquiry. I am the chair of the Supervisors of the Checklist in Londonderry and am responsible, along with two other Supervisors, for the addition, amendment or removal of anyone on our voter registration list. I'll be happy to provide information to you related to your email below.

Per NH law, there are three mechanisms the Supervisors have to remove people from the checklist. The first is via notice (with sufficient evidence) from another state of that person registering in that state. The second is notice from the New Hampshire Division of Vital Records indicating that a person has died. The last is through a process called a 30-day letter. That process requires the Supervisors to have reason to believe that a voter is no longer eligible to vote in Londonderry. With that, we send a 30-day letter to the address we have on file, giving the voter 30 days to provide evidence that they are, in fact, an eligible voter in town. In the absence of that proof, the voter is removed from the voter registration list at the next session of the Supervisors. Supervisors are only permitted to send 30-day letters and make changes to the voter registration list during official, noticed sessions.

Upon investigation, we are confident that each of the people listed below were duly qualified and eligible voters at the time of their registration.

Your message has prompted us to flag some voters listed below for 30-day letters. Because of the timing of this information, they will remain on the voter list through the November election. That said, we do have a mechanism in place for us should one of the voters we have flagged in the 30-day process present themselves to vote on Election Day.

As a resident taxpayer and voter in the town of Londonderry who has written publicly in the media about my concerns with the voter checklist and the way it has been handled by the supervisors,

I wish to use my standing as a citizen to request that town of Londonderry resources be directed to the recording and the broadcast of the next, and all future meetings of the supervisors of the checklist. Although I am writing to you as a citizen and not an elected official, It is my experience while holding elected office in Londonderry that with a week or two notice, Mr. Caron from the Public Access Center can arrange video and audio recording of meetings of town public officials. While such recording may not be broadcast live, it can then be retransmitted via londonderry's multiple Public Access television channels, as well as the Londonderry NH Town YouTube page where recordings of government proceedings are frequently broadcast.

While my standing as a taxpayer and voter should be sufficient enough to establish this request, I wish to cite several recent occurrences that have led to the need for more public visibility and more transparency of the operations of the Supervisors:

-Updated guidance from the Secretary of State's office regarding clarification of policy and procedures;

- The recent Disclosure by the supervisors that they were significantly non-compliant in the execution of their duties and following of procedures, which they claimed to be ignorant of;

-Concerns expressed by Maureen Hardy and other resident voters regarding the checklist being completely clean by the March 24 voting session;

-Confusion expressed by Maureen Hardy and other resident voters over the manner in which the supervisors have executed the clarified policies and procedures;

-Concern expressed by myself and other citizens regarding the transparency of supervisor McCurley's appointment;

-Concern expressed by myself regarding the character viability of Mr McCurley's appointment;

- Repeat concerns expressed by citizen Kristine Perez that the supervisors of the checklist are not responsive to her multiple communications. This is a direct violation of Article 1, Section 8 of the New Hampshire Constitution, which clearly states that government should be "open, ACCESSIBLE, accountable, and RESPONSIVE" (Emphasis mine.)

In making this decision I considered the perspectives of many groups – law enforcement, fire/life safety, public works, candidates, ALERT, and most importantly, the voters. Per RSA 659:43 the moderator is required to do the following:

Dear Speaker Packard:

I write concerning the conduct of Representative Kristine Perez at the September 20, 2023 meeting (the “Meeting”) of Londonderry’s Supervisors of the Checklist (the “Supervisors”) in the Clerk’s Office at Londonderry Town Hall. While the Supervisors are statutory officials not under the direction or management of the Town Council or me, the Meeting occurred in a facility under my control and for which I have responsibility as Town Manager. Additionally, it is a longstanding practice for town staff and town government to cooperate with and support the Supervisors’ performance of their statutory duties.

On this occasion, Representative Perez spent approximately forty minutes rudely berating and, at times, verbally abusing one of the elected Supervisors. For almost the entire length of their interaction, this Supervisor was unable to do her clerical work—the purpose for which the Supervisors had convened.¹ She raised all manner of grievances about the Supervisors’ actions.² Most rest upon Representative Perez’s ignorance of the law and legal procedures, despite the Supervisor bending over backwards for forty minutes to correct Representative Perez’s uninformed statements.

¹ As you may be aware, while meetings of the Supervisors of the Checklist are open to the public, they are not public meetings in the traditional sense but rather work sessions for the updating of data, and for members of the public to register to vote and change party registration, among other things.

² It goes without saying that public officials should expect to be questioned and criticized, even sharply, for their decisions. Representative Perez’s conduct was more than sharp criticism.

Two of my employees, including one who was on the other side of the building behind closed doors, heard Representative Perez “yelling.” The Supervisors described her as “incensed” and “angry,”³ and she made statements to the following effect: “This isn’t over.” Referencing her own medical background, she told the Supervisor with whom she had been interacting, “I’m glad you’re not a nurse.”


The episode was captured on the building’s surveillance cameras. I watched all forty-plus minutes of the footage. Representative Perez is visibly agitated throughout much of the interaction. In general, I would describe her as gesticulating with sarcasm and disgust towards one of the Supervisors. Several times, she is obviously yelling. The disruption to a public meeting I observed would have justified a call to the Police Department to restore order, but the Supervisors, displaying remarkable restraint and seeking to deescalate the situation, elected not to do so.

I feel compelled to write to you because of what I observed toward the end of the interaction. About forty minutes into the episode, after Representative Perez leaves the Clerk’s Office, the Supervisor she had verbally abused for the last forty minutes gets up and closes an office door behind her. Her colleagues can be seen reacting to something. One of them gets up, they confer, and one of the other Supervisors walks over to the closed door to check on her. About six minutes later, the Supervisor emerges, visibly upset. Within two minutes of sitting back down, after dabbing her eyes with a tissue, and looking at her face in her phone, the Supervisor is greeted by Representative Perez’s return to the Clerk’s Office. This time, she comes right up to within a few feet of the Supervisor and resumes yelling. The Supervisor, who had barely just collected herself, sobs for a minute into a tissue.

This is not the first time Representative Perez has conducted herself this manner. I was in the room when she told my predecessor to “shut up.” Surely, the residents of Londonderry deserve better. But more fundamentally, no human being deserves to be treated so poorly.

If there is anything you can do to modulate Representative Perez’s recurring conduct, it would be appreciated.

In response to the letters sent by you as well as Mr. Malaguti, I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge your concerns and the uncomfortable feelings caused by my elevated tone during the meeting on September 20, 2023. I regret that I was responsible for that outcome. My overwhelming frustrations unfortunately became evident. Please understand that my only goal, as I am sure is yours, is to guarantee that only legal Londonderry residents are allowed to vote in any election. I became very concerned when I learned that there were over 1000 names of those that had potentially left the town between 2018 and 2022 whose names remained on the legal voter registry. After multiple communications between the Secretary of States office and Kirsten Hildonen to understand the laws and exactly what was needed to be done, I felt the need to be present at the next available meeting. I was only there as a very concerned citizen of Londonderry. The references to my position as a State Representative were only used as a comparison of and not a statement of my representation at the meeting.

Going forward I would like to offer some suggestions:

I understand that you have guidelines that are put forward by the Secretary of State's office. They are guidelines and it appears that they offer no process by which to do your elected responsibilities in the most efficient and timely manner. I would like to suggest that you develop protocols and/or procedures that would work best for you as a group and perhaps be available in the future for any new person in that position.

I have been made aware by the Rockingham Registry of Deed office that all transactions of property are electronically sent to the Londonderry Assessor's office within 10 days of recording, making that information available for the asking. Perhaps obtaining that information for the previous weeks prior to your meetings would offer the opportunity to send 30-day letters and assist in keeping the voter list current thus avoiding long delays as found from 2018 to 2022. This has always been available, but I do not recall you mentioning this opportunity as something that has been utilized by you in the past.

I would also like to see that all family members are removed at the same time when that information is available, especially now that you have the USPS "change of address" available to you.

Please allow me to offer my assistance in implementing any of these suggestions.

In a town the size of Londonderry and with the fluctuation in voter turnout, outcomes can often be determined by a small number of votes. Therefore, the accuracy of the voter list is of the utmost importance and crucial to the integrity of the town.

I do not know whether there is, in fact, a violation as you suggest, but one consistent theme of my tenure as town manager has been to correct deficiencies that come to my attention.

Let me get a handle on the facts and reach out back out to you. I truly appreciate you contacting me directly, and I thank you in advance for your patience as I work to gather all of the facts. Election integrity is an important issue and I thank you for escalating this to my attention.
