Good morning Kirsten,

As a resident taxpayer and voter in the town of Londonderry who has written publicly in the media about my concerns with the voter checklist and the way it has been handled by the supervisors,

I wish to use my standing as a citizen to request that town of Londonderry resources be directed to the recording and the broadcast of the next, and all future meetings of the supervisors of the checklist. Although I am writing to you as a citizen and not an elected official, it is my experience while holding elected office in Londonderry that with a week or two notice, Mr. Caron from the Public Access Center can arrange video and audio recording of meetings of town public officials. While such recording may not be broadcast live, it can then be retransmitted via Londonderry's multiple Public Access television channels, as well as the Londonderry NH Town YouTube page where recordings of government proceedings are frequently broadcast.

While my standing as a taxpayer and voter should be sufficient enough to establish this request, I wish to cite several recent occurrences that have led to the need for more public visibility and more transparency of the operations of the Supervisors:

- Updated guidance from the Secretary of State's office regarding clarification of policy and procedures;
- The recent Disclosure by the supervisors that they were significantly non-compliant in the execution of their duties and following of procedures, which they claimed to be ignorant of;
- Concerns expressed by Maureen Hardy and other resident voters regarding the checklist being completely clean by the March 24 voting session;
- Confusion expressed by Maureen Hardy and other resident voters over the manner in which the supervisors have executed the clarified policies and procedures;
- Concern expressed by myself and other citizens regarding the transparency of supervisor McCurley's appointment;
- Concern expressed by myself regarding the character viability of Mr McCurley's appointment;
- Repeat concerns expressed by citizen Kristine Perez that the supervisors of the checklist are not responsive to her multiple communications. This is a direct violation of Article 1, Section 8 of the New Hampshire Constitution, which clearly states that government should be "open, ACCESSIBLE, accountable, and RESPONSIVE" (Emphasis mine.)

In order to bring Londonderry into maximum possible compliance with the intent of the New Hampshire constitution, by improving the accessibility and openness of proceedings of public officials;

in order for the public to engage in maximum visibility and monitoring of the other various concerns raised;

and in order to increase public engagement and awareness of the operations of public officials, which I believe you are specifically charged with as an employee of the town of Londonderry;

I would like to request that the December 18th 2023 and all future meetings of the Supervisors of the Checklist be recorded by the Town of Londonderry.

Good morning,

I just want to register in writing my objection as a taxpaying resident of Londonderry to Brian McCurley's appointment as a Supervisor of the Checklist. I previously wrote in expressing my concerns that this Supervisor's appointment, while apparently lawful under the RSA, did not happen in a transparent manner with resident input. The Supervisors may not be required to solicit such input under law, but the law is the minimum standard; the "floor" and not the "ceiling" if you will.

As a resident who served with Brian at a Londonderry volunteer organization, I can personally testify to the fact that he has taken actions within the community outside his elected office that were immoral, unscrupulous, secretive, and (in my opinion) malicious.

It is my personal opinion as a taxpaying citizen that Brian McCurley does not possess the vital personal integrity necessary to be entrusted with the most sacred Constitutional duty of maintaining our voter roles and protecting the ballot process.

In addition to my personal observations of his lacking sufficient character for this position, it is also the expressed concern and observation of many members of the community, without intending this as personal attack, that Mr. McCurley seems to [REDACTED].

While I wish Mr. McCurley well with this reported issue, I feel obligated to note that the Federal Government considers [REDACTED] to be red flags when examining the character of applicants for employment, as such issues present possible weaknesses in the character of the applicant that could be exploited by mal-actors.

Given that election integrity is a pressing current concern of NH citizens, and given the significant compliance issues already noted by citizens with this current body of Supervisors, The Town of Londonderry ought to follow Federal precedent and take careful note of Mr. McCurley's [REDACTED] so that they do not potentially interfere with the integrity of the voting process. I have included Moderator Jonathan Kipp on my concerns.

It is my request that this correspondence would be read into the record at the next meeting of the Londonderry Supervisors of the Checklist.

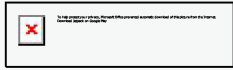

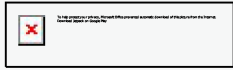

I noticed the calendar/tone website states that town hall is closed today but does not state why, which I thought was confusing.

I then checked around the town website and don't see anything about observing Columbus day. The closest I found was that the town library, even being a branch of local government, listed being closed today in honor of indigenous peoples day, something that I found to be a nice concept-but inconsistent with the federal government's definition of the holiday, and why branches of local government are closed today.

Below you will find a press release signed by the current United States president, Joseph Biden Jr, in honor of the historical contributions that Italian Americans have made to this nation.

Given the national pushback and blatant bigotry against Italian Americans in recent years, citizens seem to have forgotten that this federal holiday was specifically enacted in the wake of a racist Massacre against people of Italian ancestry. Attempts to whitewash our American history by ignoring this day are sadly becoming more common.

I sent a similar communication to the library as an arm of my town government, and I am requesting here that the TOL show its commitment to being anti-racist, the definition of which is not simply avoiding racism, but actively working to root it out and eliminate it from our social and political institutions. The town was quick to show how responsive it can be in regards to anti-racist concerns when it quickly condemned the Confederate flag after old home day 2022.

I am hoping that the town will continue this positive trend of being anti-racist by publishing this White House press release, rather than marginalizing Italian Americans in Londonderry by simply ignoring and allowing the holiday to go by without nodding to why town offices are closed.

I am requesting a response to this email & corrective action by the end of the work week

public meeting, in addition to Trustees of Trust Funds, to approve this transfer. Motion by Jonathan Esposito to authorize Justin as our bookkeeper to move these funds, seconded by Jim Green, All Trustees voted in favor, motion passes.

f) \$124,000 in cemetery income is available to be spent. Justin will be discussing with Cemetery Trustees for the \$17,500.00 reimbursement figure to be increased to \$25,000.00 to offset the burden to the taxpayer and to account for increased maintenance costs. To be potentially increased in FY2024.

g) Joanne Estey fund, income was discussed, bookkeeper is anticipating a request for a check to be distributed from Cambridge Trust to Mary Lou Chamberlain, so that she can draft an award letter and send the check/award to the award recipients.

4) Administrative Business:

a) Kirsten began to speak on 91A, definition of a Quorum as it relates to a 3 person board. Trustees must be careful to not host an illegal public meeting, as two Trustees discussing official business can be considered a quorum in accordance with 91A. Information can be disseminated utilizing the BCC function of Microsoft email, this would prohibit accidental “reply-alls” and help reduce accidental communication that could be construed as an unlawful public meeting. Jim Green requested clarification & restated the policy, at which time Kirsten affirmed this understanding. If a decision is required ASAP such as moving a meeting time, better to communicate to Justin & Kirsten and they can function as a go between to avoid an illegal public meeting.

Jim Green provided an example of agenda discussion. Kirsten clarified that we can send information but cannot discuss the merit of whether an item should be added to the agenda. Jonathan asked if use of BCC excessively prohibits citizens from seeing who is copied on public correspondence. Kirsten clarified that the BCC line would be visible from the senders side, but later stated she would confirm with Town IT.

b) Trustees reaffirmed that all trustees are committed to their public offices, that we will attempt to check emails at least once weekly, with the understanding that no presumptions will be made if Trustees overlook checking their emails for a period of time.

c) Jonathan asked whether Trustees wished to further pursue source documents for Trusts that we do not currently possess, as the State did not produce any new documents. Trustees discussed whether we should have a working session or meeting to review 2-3 boxes of trust related documents, before we further entertain discussion from the State.

d) Trustee’s discussed 91A compliance in reviewing correspondence sent out on behalf of the Trustees, whether or not it needed to be reviewed, whether such review would constitute a public meeting. Kirsten provided guidance on 91A, suggesting that a motion to empower a Trustee to make an inquiry, not a decision, on the Trustees behalf, should be sufficient to

approve for the Public Record any follow on correspondence. Kirsten clarified that other Board's typically empower one another to make communications without the necessity of reviewing the individual email verbiage.

e) Jim made a motion for Jonathan to pursue inquiry with the State. Cindi seconded. All trustees in favor, motion passes, Jonathan will continue pursuing inquiry with the Charitable Trusts Unit and the State of NH archive. Jim discussed that we will continue to move forward in a collegial manner and allow for Trustees to exercise their duties, addressing any individual issues that arise if needed.

f) Justin asked for a motion to approve July 20th 2023 meeting minutes, if there were no questions regarding input. Trustees discussed providing less physical copies to save paper. Motion by Jonathan to approve 7.20.23 draft minutes, Jim seconds, all trustees vote in favor, none opposed, Motion passes, minutes from 7.20.23 are finalized for public consumption/record.

f) Jim recommended that we schedule our next public meeting to enable us to further peruse documents in the Town's possession, perhaps each taking a box to peruse.

5) Intermittent Public Comment:

i) Ann Chiampa asked about an agenda, which is not required.

ii) Ann Chiampa asked Justin to raise maintenance concerns to Cemetery Trustees during his attendance at their public meeting this evening. Justin agrees.

iii) Richard Bielinski asked about increasing the Trustees of Trust Funds to 5. Justin stated he was not clear on the procedure of that. Jonathan commented that this may be authority delegated to the Town. Justin and Kirsten stated that they can examine this, Kirsten stated she would follow up with Richard in a reasonable time

iv) Richard Bielinski offered public suggested in response to Admin business that we use technology as a way to avoid using the BCC line to attempt to comply with 91A. Kirsten agreed that this is a future step the Trustees may move in, but the goal is closest immediate compliance. Jonathan asked if Sharepoint or a similar resource would be available. Justin & Kirsten clarified that internal servers/folders are currently utilized but stated that further discussion would occur.

v) Richard offered public comment that he feels the Trustees are unnecessarily complicating the matter of individual correspondence.

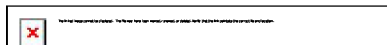

Good morning,

The AG's office suggested that I start with the Town Manager in raising the below inquiry and proceed from there as required.

I have a concern that we have an appointed town official serving in an incompatible dual role.

Trustee Cindi Rice Conley was appointed to the Trustees of Trust Funds vacant office at the public meeting of the Town Council on 4.24.23.

However, at the time of her appointment to Trustee, she was, and remains, School District Moderator, which she was duly elected to, uncontested, at the March 8th 2022 election.

I believe this is an incompatible holding of dual office under NH RSA 669:7, which states that no person may hold at the same time, the offices of Moderator and of Trustee of Trust Funds.

I am aware that the School District is a separate arm of government, like the library. My concern is that:

A. The law does not distinguish between whether the moderator office is with the Town or School, it simply lists it as an incompatible office with Trustee;

B. Much like the Budget Committee, Trustees of Trust Funds are fiduciary agents for both arms of government. The NH DOJ Trustees Handbook, RSA 31:31, and others clearly delineate Trustees authority to receive and hold in trust, gifts and other financial contributions to the Londonderry School District;

C. Londonderry Trustees of Trust Funds directly oversee and administer 3 Trusts relative to the Londonderry School District: the Gilcreast-Greely Fund, the Morrison Family/Morrison School Fund, & the James Morrison Trust; her duty in the administration of such would appear to be in conflict with her duties as Moderator.

As these roles do conflict, I believe the onus is on the Town of Londonderry to check with Ms. Conley what role she may wish to remain occupying, and then for the appropriate Londonderry entity to appoint another individual in accordance with relevant law & policy.

I could not find a specific Conflict of Interest item in the Town Charter that would apply; the AG suggested (not being able to provide legal guidance of course) that the Town Manager should be able to check with counsel on the incompatibility issue.

Then, copying a practice that the School Board used to engage in, public comment was only entertained at the very end of the meeting, when many interested attendees had to leave to get home to family or other obligations.

Art then mocked this in his comments to citizen Ray Breslin, when Ray approached to speak, joking about where everyone was that came and that they had all left. This is tone deaf, and gives the appearance that public comment waiting until the end was an intentional choice to discourage the amount of feedback the Board would hear.

I fail to see why it is amusing to the Chair or others that citizens wanted to speak but were frustrated in their efforts to do so. Rather than providing for dialogue to take a more civil route in Town, such actions feed into the perception that the public's voice in Londonderry does not matter.

Trustee Conley received the correspondence she requested **as of the very next time I signed in to my email**, with no delay.

For the record, I did inquire with other elected officials in the community, and it is **not at all unusual** for a period of weeks to pass in between email responses back and forth between stakeholders. For example, members of the Budget committee have stated that it is not unusual for weeks to pass while awaiting an email response from Patrick their chair, or from Justin as the Town POC. It is even less unusual considering that her original inquiry to me was made mid summer, greater than 6 weeks from our next scheduled meeting session, and not relevant to a time sensitive matter.

Thank you for allowing me to put to rest any concerns regarding information being asked for.

Please continue to communicate with myself about Trustee business as you do now. Moving forward, you should reach out to Kirsten for:

- IT issues
- Building access and room reservations
- Posting on the Town website & social media pages, including minutes and agendas
- Communication with the Town Manager
- Getting new members set up (oaths, emails, etc.)

One of the first initiatives to make sure you are all aware that Kirsten is handling is our effort to make Town Hall the most safe and secure place we can for our employees and residents. You might have noticed some of these measures have already been put in place.

The door to the upper level now has a keypad on it that locks automatically at 5:05pm. The elevator is locked and the double doors next to it are shut by town staff at 5pm when they depart for the day. The purpose of this is to secure the majority of the building while leaving the public areas accessible to those attending meetings after working hours.

Most committee members will not have a need to use the upper floor. Moving forward, we would like to try to schedule the majority of committee meetings on the first floor in the Sunnycrest and Moose Hill conference rooms, where meetings can be recorded if needed.

That being said, if a committee chair has a compelling reason to access the upstairs and the rest of the building, please send Kirsten an email, and she will work with you to ensure the access you need. If you have concerns, Kirsten will be am happy to come to one of the meetings to address it.

Please look for more emails from Kirsten in the coming weeks. She is open to suggestions, questions or input you may have as the Town is always looking at ways to streamline our processes and improve transparency for our residents.

Foremost is that this ensures any communication sent to an employee or committee/board member can reach them securely without getting caught in a spam filter or firewall. These security measures may occasionally block an unsolicited email sent directly from a private email address, but using the contact form avoids this.

If you'd like to see how it works, you can test it using my contact form (<https://www.londonderrynh.gov/user/111/contact>) and I'll forward you the email it sends to me. It's a great system that protects our information security while allowing residents access to all town personnel and officials.
